
- Heart, vascular and circulatory diseases



Last admission one hour before closing time. Pools close 20 minutes before closing time.

Open year-round. Closed on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Good Friday and 1st May.

The SoleBad Cannstatt is a healing and health spa without specific child-friendly facilities. It is not recommended that children under the age of 7 visit the pool. Children under the age of 3 are not allowed to use the pools.

Children and teenagers up to and including 15 years of age may only enter with an accompanying adult. Minors are only allowed to enter the sauna with a parent or quardian.

Important Informations

Children up to and including 6 years have free admission to the swimming pool.

Accompanying persons of severely disabled persons receive free admission if a "B" or "H" is entered in the severely disabled person's ID card.

Price reduction of 1.00 Euro on the single admission ticket for holders of the Stuttgart Bonuscard.

When leaving the pool, the admission ticket **loses** its **validity**.

Electronic chips for multiple use, "Schwabenkärtle" and vouchers are valid for **4 years from purchase**.
